TWO POWER DESIGNS, 2nd & 3rd IN 1967 CHAMPS

Over eight years of progressive development have gone into George French's Night Train and the result is a model that only rarely has flown less than the intended maximum. Refinements include a reworked Super Tigre G.15 (John West's was the one actually used at Sazena) mounted in a lightweight metal pan, and the Variable Incidence Tailplane to

control the climb and trim the glide. Consistency of the Night Train in World Championships is emphasised by its high placings in the last four events, as well as the Zell-am-See International contests and British meetings. The Full-Size plan is due for publication later in the year in Model Airplane News and will subsequently be available through A.P.S.
